This year has been another great one for us all, underpinned by your remarkable investment of £286,054 in the Tyrone GAA cause. That brings your contribution to £4.75m since we started as The Millennium Initiative back in 1995. Whilst our income is now reducing, as planned, from our 'peak Garvaghey years', Club Tyrone remains Tyrone GAA's single largest income stream.

We don't raise money for the sake of it but to invest in things that make life better for Tyrone and its people. The old Irish saying is very true - 'Déannan sparán trom croi éadrom ... a heavy purse makes for a light heart' - and your contributions make Tyrone GAA life far, far easier than it otherwise would be.

The power of Club Tyrone is based on things that go to the heart of what the GAA should be about. Firstly, we have a County and people in it who know and appreciate the GAA

Secondly, we have a GAA County that's very well-managed, with a County Committee, Sub-Committees and Officers who take measured decisions, particularly when it comes to the financials. We do what we do as willing volunteers because we cherish our Tyrone heritages, people and communities. We're also wedded to the fundamental GAA values of volunteerism, self-help, 'We not me' and 'Putting in, not taking out'.

FOR US THE GAA IS NEVER ABOUT BURDENS.

We're not just precious about WHAT we do and WHY ... we're also precious about HOW we do it. We fit wholly and unequivocally within the Tyrone GAA governance structure, work to an approved annual work-plan, meet and report monthly to the Tyrone GAA County Committee and then to the annual Tyrone GAA Couvention.

Our financials are audited as part of the Tyrone GAA audit process. We also Report annually to our donors and this 2016 Report format reflects the important requirements of the Charity Commission for NI.


TYRONE'S FINANCIALS YEAR ENDED 31 OCTOBER 2016


Yet again Tyrone has posted a surplus (£146,849) after a year's intensive work. Our borrowings for Garvaghey however stand at £1.226m, an increase of £130,000 from last year which is due solely to the 'post-Brexit' fall in sterling (our Garvaghey loan is in Euros).

With your continued support we'll clear the debt on schedule.But we do have work to do!

Public benefit drives both the GAA and Club Tyrone. Club Tyrone made a difference in 2016 by supporting Tyrone GAA to:

Tyrone GAA's 43-acre £7m **Garvaghey Centre celebrates Gaelic Tyrone through its six** floodlit GAA pitches, training area and ball-wall, 10 changing rooms, 200-seat auditorium, reception/foyer area, canteen and team support facilities, meeting and office spaces plus external walkways and environmental area.

We built Garvaghey as our bulwark against growing service centralisation, the flight to the cities and ever-increasing globalization whereby local variety, difference and tradition are steadily weakened. Garvaghey speaks quietly but clearly that for nonmetropolitan Ireland the good things in life are not always to be found somewhere else, that the local and indigenous have a

unique and precious value and vibrancy. It is about creating value for Tyrone and its people. Above all, Garvaghey is about Legacy, about this generation leaving something important and sustainable to those who come after us

More than 52,000 people used Garvaghey this year.

Club Tyrone is honoured and proud to have raised some £6.3m for Garvaghey and to continue to support its year-onyear running costs.
