- We work wholly and unequivocally within the Tyrone GAA governance structure, delivering an approved annual work-plan, meeting and reporting monthly to the Tyrone GAA County Committee and then to the annual Tyrone GAA County Convention, with our financials audited as part of the Tyrone GAA audit process
- We Report annually to our donors and welcome the positive involvement of and feedback from all

# DOWN TO BUSINESS, CLUB TYRONE AT WORK IN 2019

- Secured a 'gift aid' tax repayment
   of just over £12,000 from HMRC

- Hosted the Annual Club Tyrone
   Members' Night in May, attended by over 200 Patrons, Members and friends
- Scoped, launched and recruited over 90 members for a 'Hub Patrons' planned giving funding scheme for Tyrone's new Performance Hub project at Garvaghey and secured on behalf of Tyrone GAA £20,000 in funding for the project from the Fermanagh and Omagh Council
- Held our now annual 'Meet the Players' event after the Galway Allianz League game in March involving over

300 children and young people

 Established a Club Tyrone Hub in Philadelphia and delivered a third annual Club Tyrone New York Golf Event in Hudson National, New York



Hosted at Garvaghey, a Nollaig na mBan ('Women's Christmas') event (6 January, 54 people) and workshops/seminars on St Brigid's Cross-Making (31 January, 30 people) and on the social and economic issues facing Rural GAA (30 March, 34 people)

- Developed a new digital celebration of our Members at Garvaghey
- Contributed to Tyrone GAA's Red Hand View match programmes



# Met formally as a Committee 12 times



- Reported monthly to the Tyrone County Committee and to the County Convention
- Published the 2018 Club Tyrone Annual Report and circulated it to Members, Patrons, others and The Charity Commission

Attended 'brother/sister County GAA events' in Antrim (Saffron Business Forum) and Derry (Club Derry Golf Day) and met to talk business with fellow Gaels from Cork, Mayo, Monaghan and Scotland.





## I FINANCIAL RIGOUR

### **Smacht ar Airgeadas**

Yet again Tyrone has managed its finances well and at the end of 2019 posted a surplus (£220,521) after another year's intensive work. But we still have borrowings of £599,923 against Garvaghey (reduced significantly from £749,643 a year ago) and are now also spending on the significant capital investment of the Performance Hub at Garvaghey.

Your Club Tyrone contributions remain central to Tyrone GAA's financial vigour, accounting for one-pound-in-six of its 2019 income:

# I PUBLIC BENEFIT

Public benefit has always driven both the GAA and Club Tyrone. Club Tyrone created significant public benefit in 2019 by supporting Tyrone GAA to:

- Provide and manage Gaelic sporting, cultural and heritage activities for 55 GAA Clubs, 550 teams, 11,872 adult and 8,596 youth participants across Tyrone
- Deliver coaching in Clubs and Schools across Tyrone and through 53 Tyrone GAA Summer Camps involving 5,364 children
- Prepare, organise and field seven different amateur adult and underage Football and Hurling teams to represent our County and its 182,000 people, and which this year attracted a gross attendance of around 300,000 people at different venues across Ireland
- Resource Acadamh Thír Eoghain, which continues to energise the sporting and personal development of 200 of our young people
- Manage and maintain the Garvaghey Centre, our multi-layered facility which delivered Gaelic sporting and cultural activity for over 55,000 people this year
- Deliver a range of initiatives to support and develop individual and community health and well-being
- Build pride and contentment in self, in community and in place for everyone living in Tyrone and help us all to better understand and appreciate our people, history, culture and heritage

# TYRONE'S PERFORMANCE HUB TURNING THE VISION INTO REALITY

Since 2016 Tyrone GAA has been scoping and planning a Performance Hub facility at Garvaghey, something which we need to help develop our County teams and to meet a deficit in Tyrone.


In 2019 work started on building the Hub and, equally importantly, work also started on funding it. Whilst it remains very disappointing that the GAA at national or provincial levels has not responded to our requests for funding support and, beyond a greatly appreciated grant offer of £20,000 from the Fermanagh and Omagh Council, 'civic society/government' here has yet again failed to

engage, it's so positive to report that once again Gaelic Tyrone was not content to just sit and 'curse the dark.'

In April 2019 we launched a Hub Patrons scheme through which people gift £5,000 to the Hub project. As always, Tyrone stood up unflinchingly to the plate and by the year end we had some 90 Patrons committed to us. Tyrone is simply blessed to have these special, visionary and generous people.

The Hub is on schedule for completion at the end of March and it's our ambition to showcase it to all our Club Tyrone people at our 2020 Annual Members' Night, currently lined up for 14 May.
