Public benefit has always driven both the GAA and Club Tyrone. And in 2022 Club Tyrone continued to create significant public benefit by supporting Tyrone GAA to:

- Provide, manage and support Gaelic sporting, cultural and heritage activities for 55 GAA Clubs, 550 teams, and nearly 21,000 members across Tyrone
- Prepare, organize and field amateur adult and underage Football and Hurling teams to represent our County and its 182,000 people

- Manage, maintain and 'bring out of COVID' the Garvaghey Centre, our multilayered facility which has now attracted half-a-million users since it opened
- Deliver several initiatives to support and develop individual and community health and well-being
- Tackle many of Tyrone's chronic service and facility deficits
- Build pride and contentment in self, in community, and in place and help us all to better understand and appreciate our people, history, culture and heritage

Over the nine months from Summer 2021 to Spring 2022, our Senior Footballers, our Senior Hurlers and our Under 20 Footballers all won their All-Ireland Championships. And our Minor Footballers came within a point of winning theirs.

Over those same months our Senior, our Under 20 and our Minor Footballers all won their Ulster Championships. And our Senior Hurlers won their Division of the Allianz League.

Meanwhile, Tyrone GAA has certainly reciprocated. Among much else, in that time our teams have won 31 major Ulster and 16 major All-Ireland Football titles. And we've planned, delivered, and added to our 'best-in-class' Garvaghey Centre, on time and on budget.

Back then we thought: 'Tyrone can't wait'. So we couldn't wait either. And we still think that. That heartfelt urgency still drives Club Tyrone.



It's always good to report how well Tyrone GAA manages its finances.


At the end of 2022 our County posted yet another surplus, this time one of £65,013.

That of course needs to be seen against remaining borrowings of £160,202 against Garvaghey, although those have been paid down from £304,885 a year ago. In another year or so Garvaghey will be debt-free, on schedule as originally planned. That's a huge achievement as Tyrone's peak borrowings for the project went well beyond £2m. And it's very largely down to you, our Club Tyrone people, who in the same time period also put up the £0.5m needed to build and fit out our Performance Hub.
